Admissions

ADMISSIONS

We are a six class school, with a PAN (Pupil Admission Number) of 30 per year group. If you are considering applying for a place at Newtown Primary School, we would be delighted to speak to you about all aspects of our school. We truly believe that the best way to get to know our school is through a personalised tour. All parents who wish to express a preference for a place at Newtown Primary School must do so using the Devon Local Authority Common Application Form (D-CAF1). This is available online as part of the Step by Step primary admissions booklet, copies of which are available by calling the My Devon team on 0345 155 1019.

All applications, for September, need to have been made between the November and January before. The Local Authority co-ordinates admissions for all primary schools in Devon, and will write to you (or email if you applied online) in April to advise of the school place you have been allocated for your child.

If you wish your child to be admitted to Newtown Primary School other than at the first intake to Reception you will need to follow the guidance on the Devon County Council Education and Families webpage.





General Information

COMMUNICATION



ClassDojo is used across the school as a key means of communication. The ClassDojo App allows teachers to communicate directly with parents—sharing learning, celebrating successes and communicating day-to-day information. Parents and teachers are also able to communicate through a private messaging function on the app. When your child starts at the school you will be given a help sheet and unique code to sign up to ClassDojo.

Schoolgateway



School Gateway is used as another means of communication across the school. It can be used to book clubs, pay for school lunches, pay and give permission for school trips and can also be used to send messages to and from the school.

Y1 and Y2 pupils are dropped off at the playground gate and will be welcomed by a member of staff. The class teachers are available for parents to talk to before registration starts at 8.55am. The pupils in all KS2 classes go straight to their classrooms when they arrive at school. There are morning tasks set up for the children to complete on their arrival.





School Uniform

It is our policy that children wear school uniform when attending our school. Our uniform is designed to be smart and practical. We have ensured that the majority or our uniform is widely available at retailers such as supermarkets so as to avoid unnecessary expense.

Stitch2 Print

Any items with a logo are available for purchase from Stitch2Print on the following link <u>Stitch2Print</u>. Stitch2Print are also able to add initials to some products, and if provided with a blue jumper they can add the logo, please contact them for further information. Stitch2Print will deliver uniform to your home or you can collect from their shop. They will also hold regular pop-up shops at Newtown, so you are able to try on uniform.

You are also able to purchase logoed uniform from Thomas Moore in Exeter - 102/104 Fore St. Exeter EX4 3JB.

School uniform is:

- Royal blue Newtown sweatshirt, cardigan or fleece with logo
- White polo shirt (no logo required)
- Black or grey trousers, skirts or shorts
- Royal blue check dress (summer only)
- White or black socks (or tights)
- Sensible shoes with an enclosed toe and plenty of support. Shoes must be either black or navy.
- Newtown book bags, bags, hats and beanies are available (Stitch2Print can initial these)







School Uniform Cont...

PE Kit

- Children need a clearly named PE bag for storing their t-shirt, shorts and trainers.
- Black shorts
- White t-shirt (a logoed white t-shirt is available from Stitch2Print and can be initialled at no extra cost)
- Trainers or plimsolls are needed for outdoor PE (a change of footwear from the school shoe). It is safest for children to work in bare feet when indoors and using apparatus.
 Pupils should NOT wear astro-turf trainers at any time.
- Black tracksuits can be worn for outdoor PE in the winter

Hair / Cosmetics

We expect hair that is longer than shoulder length to be tied back at all times (boys and girls). Hair should be of a natural colour. Hair accessories must be plain, simple and suitable for all PE lessons. Hair should not have lines or patterns shaved into it. No make-up or nail varnish to be worn.

<u>Jewellery</u>

Jewellery is not part of our school uniform. Only one plain stud earring is allowed in each ear. No other body piercing will be acceptable. Please ensure that any studs are removed or protected / covered with micro-pore tape when taking part in any PE activity. We expect parents to provide the tape . Jewellery which is worn for religious observance must be agreed with the Headteacher. We cannot accept any responsibility for lost or broken precious items if they find their way into school.






Our Curriculum

At the heart of our curriculum lie three core values: pursuit of academic excellence; the explicit development of metacognition; and crucially, character education.

Academic Excellence is fundamental within our curriculum model. The children's acquisition of a deep body of knowledge within subject disciplines, will enable them to express their learning



to the highest standard. When children achieve excellence, this gives them the confidence to challenge themselves further. Through this process of experiencing success, they will develop character, for example grit, determination, self-efficacy and courage.

Character Education Whilst academic success remains a core priority, developing character is also an essential element of our curriculum model. Our curriculum gives children opportunities to make a positive impact on society. We want them to grasp the possibilities and opportunities of life beyond the classroom, to enable them to thrive at each and every challenge they face in life and make a difference to themselves and those around them.

Metacognition Our curriculum not only focuses on achieving character whilst pursuing academic excellence, but also emphasises deep learning through developing the skills of metacognition. We use an enquiry approach to drive our learning experiences, making the reflective learning process explicit. In addition to this, tools for thinking will be taught to support children's higher order thinking, synthesis of knowledge and creating of new thinking. However, metacognition can only be developed within a knowledge-rich curriculum.

Awards and Rewards

- Each week the class teacher awards one pupil in their class the 'Star of The Week' certificate. This is presented in our whole school celebration assembly.
- Each week a secret member of staff is chosen, they decide over the week who has shown the best Newtown character. They will then nominate a 'Character Champion' who will receive a certificate in the schools celebration assembly.
- Pupils are awarded house points for excellent behaviour, hard work and helpfulness around school. We have four house teams:

Sandford, Portland, Belmont and Clifton

At the end of each half term the winning house has an extra playtime.





Inclusion and Special Educational Needs

Newtown Primary School's Special Needs Co-ordinator (SENDCo) is Mrs Katy Rushby.

Our SEND policy is available on the school website or from the school office.

We plan and deliver a curriculum that all children in a class can access. Sometimes, however, a child may find learning very difficult and if this is the case we consult with parents to plan the best way forward. The school's SEN co-ordinator (SENDCo) may decide to carry out screening and assessment procedures. Specific targets are written for each term and these are shared with the child and reviewed at the end of each term. Other professionals, such as educational psychologists, learning support teachers, speech therapists or the behaviour support team may also be involved.

Early identification of need can often avoid difficulties later on.

If you have concerns about your child's needs these can be discussed with the class teacher or SENDCo.



SAFEGUARDING

Our school community has a duty to safeguard and promote the welfare of children.

The full Safeguarding and Child Protection Policy is available to download from the school's website.

On occasions we may need to share information and work in partnership with other agencies when there are concerns about a child's welfare.

We will always ensure that our concerns about pupils are discussed with their parents/carers first, unless we believe that this is not in the child's best interest.

If you have concerns regarding the safety and well-being of pupils at Newtown Primary School please do not hesitate to contact a member of the safeguarding team. Alternatively, if you have serious safeguarding concerns about a child or young person you can contact the Multi-Agency Safeguarding Hub (MASH) on 0345 155 1071 (or out of hours 0845 60000 388). Breaktime & Lunchtimes



Breaktimes

Children have a supervised morning break on either the KS1 or KS2 playground. Toys are generally discouraged as they can get lost or broken which can cause problems.

The children in the Foundation Stage, Year 1 and Year 2 get free fruit or vegetables to eat at break time. The older children may bring fruit to eat during the mid-morning break. Please no biscuits, crisps or sweets. We expect the children to have a water bottle in the classroom which they drink from during the day. We ask that the bottle goes home daily to be washed.

Lunchtimes

School Dinners are provided by DevonNorse and cost £2.50; these can be ordered daily. Orders are placed by the school with DevonNorse by 9.30am, therefore any cancellations of meals after this time will be charged.

During registration pupils are asked their meal choice for that day – either option 1 which is the main meal, option 2 which is the vegetarian option, a jacket potato with filling or packed lunch (brought from home). Spare menus are available on ClassDojo from the school office.

If children have packed lunches, the containers must be named. Please do not send glass containers.





Free School Meals

Free School Meals (FSM)

Under the Government 'Universal Infant Free School Meals' scheme, children in Reception and Years 1 and 2 are entitled to a hot meal free of charge. However, parents and guardians are encouraged to apply for free school meals when they enrol their child in school regardless of which year they are in, as this can help their child's school to attract additional <u>pupil premium</u> funding to support learning.

Children in Years 3 - 6 are required to pay for meals unless parents are in receipt of a means tested benefit and have registered for free school meals. A 'meal' is a main meal with vegetables, a dessert and a drink.

How to apply

The quickest and easiest way to apply for free school meals is through the Devon County Council Portal Citizen Portal.

The person making the application should be the person who holds parental responsibility for the child that they are applying for. This will result in an instant decision direct to your phone, tablet or computer. A print out of the result or screen shot confirming eligibility should be shown to the School Office allowing free meals to commence straight away.

Parents and carers can also ring the Education Helpline on 0345 155 1019 to request a paper copy of the application





School Clubs

Breakfast Club

7:45am – 8:45am - Maximum Capacity – 10 children £3.50 per child, per session.

All sessions will be held in the community room.

Please access breakfast club through the school office. There is a wraparound care bell to indicate your arrival to staff. Parents/Carers are asked not to enter the building.

After School Club

3.25pm – 5.45pm - Maximum Capacity – 10 children £8.00 per child, per session.

All sessions will be held in the community room.

Collection will be through the school office. There is a wraparound care bell to indicate your arrival to staff. Parents/Carers are asked not to enter the building.







Friends of Newtown School (**FONS**) is led by an enthusiastic group of parents who work incredibly hard to support the school and provide additional experiences and opportunities for the children.
